On the same Sunday, there were two children who have been baptized by our Beloved District Apostle in our church. Also, two children receive the Holy Sealing






Youth Photoshoot – December 7, 2014

Experience of Faith

Life is like a puzzle, made up of pieces, wherein we are not certain whether the pieces of puzzle were holding is the right one to solve the puzzle of life. Also, some says life is like a race that full of incidents along the race, on how to deal your life in the racetrack and how fast to overcome with it to complete the race of life.

Whatever life we have or whoever we are, we are always confident that the last piece of puzzle or the right track for the race of life is in the hand of God to make our life meaningful, complete and wonderful.

I was born with positive vibes, in the happy and wonderful environment. Although we lived in a mountainous area of province, I can say that my childhood moments were great. I love fairy tales, because everyone's life has happy ending.

I grew up in a prayerful family, where everything I wished for, I bring it all in prayer. We were trained to pray always, as my father was a minister before during my childhood, and I can say that my prayer life before was very strong. I always include in my prayers everything I wanted when I grow old.

As I grow older, I became aware of the things around me, especially to my family. My family has been tested several times with our faith. From mountainous area of province, we transferred to the city because of financial problem. My father can no longer work at the farm coz he suffered from some illness, at the same time; he is already old for farming. The whole family decided to transfer to the city.

Living in a city was not an easy life for us; for we don't know the ways of living in the city at the same time the source of income is not stable. There are times that we don't even have food to eat. I really witnessed the struggles and sacrifices of my parents for the family.

Despite of lack of financial means, I never lost hope. I always pray that someday, everything will to be okay. That someday, I will reach all my dreams in life, that my life will be like those written in fairy tales (has happy ending). Everything, I put it all in prayer, every decision I make, because I strongly believe you can never go wrong with prayer.

After graduating in High School a chance of going to college was so small. Even though I can have a 50% discount on my tuition fee at any school, my parents still can't afford to provide the other half. In order to pay at least half of my tuition fee I applied for the DOST Scholarship, and prayed for it every day. I thought it's the only way I can proceed to college, unfortunately, I wasn't able to pass the exam.

When the result of the exam came out, I questioned God, why He didn't allow me to pass that exam, what am I going to do after, does my prayer and faith not enough? All I wanted is to help my family. (Which is absolutely wrong deed-of questioning God). At that very moment I suddenly saw a saying in front of me, written in the upper corner of the classroom board that says, "Don't be discourage if God didn't answer your prayers now, because He has something better for you" - I was shocked after reading this line. I realized that God never sleeps, and He knows better than us. Right that very moment, I asked forgiveness and hold on to his promise and ask His guidance again.

Right after graduation, I decided to work for two months so that I can pay half of my tuition fee. I enrolled myself in school. I used some of my earnings from my two month work and avail the scholarship discounts. The first six months of my college life, was a struggle because of financial incapacity. I always cried every exam day, for I don't have enough means to pay for the remaining balance. I don't even have an allowance daily in school, and just to make savings, sometimes I skip meals. By God's grace, God uses people around me to survive. My classmates helped me and introduced me to the school for a part time job. After my interview with the Guidance Counselor of the school, I got the part time job.

Still, my earnings from my part time job were not enough to pay my tuition fee, plus the discount of the tuition fee has been lowered to 25% because I was not able to maintain the desired general grade.

After first semester, I decided to stop for I don't want to be a burden to my parents anymore. The reality speaks, and they don't have the means. During semestral break, my heart and mind still wanted to go to school but I know in myself that I cannot continue anymore. I cried every single night praying to God about my desires of going back to school and desire to help my family and attain my dreams.

The time of enrolment for the second semester came. "God's delay is never God's denial". One day, a big surprise came to my life and to my family. A staff from our school came to the house and brought good news. They have been looking for me for two weeks already to inform me that the President of the school has been looking for me, to be his SCHOLAR. I can now go back to school with nothing to pay, plus I can have my free uniform and books too. At the same time, I can still have my part time job as part time in the registrar's office with pay, just to serve as my daily allowance in school.

After Hearing that news, I cannot help my tears from falling, as I saw my mom in tears too. It was really an amazing day for me and also to my parents. "God always answer prayers".

That's the time, I remember the saying I read the time that I questioned God. That He has better plan for everyone, and there are reasons why He didn't allow some things to happen. God uses people around us to bring His gifts to us. I graduated, and got a job after graduation.

After graduation, another test came to my life, my mom been diagnosed with lung cancer. Her life ends when I was about to be able to repay her sacrifices for me. It was so hard to accept it, but we can't do nothing about it and just have to accept it. I still miss her, and will always miss her.

There are lots of lessons in life to be learned. We can never get lost in every test that we'll be facing if we put everything to God in prayer. We might not get what we hope for, but for sure we will get what we deserve. For everything there is a season, and there are reasons to everything. Only God knows!
