

Makati, Youth Meeting

Youth has question, and that is natural. Even the children they always have questions, more and more they grow up. Asking is healthy and a due process of learning because nothing can be accomplished without asking questions.

Last October 04, 2003, Apostle Hebeisen gathered the Makati Youth for a Youth Meeting Seminar about the topic "GOING ABROAD". Here is the topic chosen by the youth during the Pangasinan Youth Day. The important thing to be asked here is, "can God bless us only abroad?"

God's blessing is God's blessing whether that is now abroad or at home. It is totally wrong to believe God blesses only abroad. This is very much offending to our Heavenly Father because it degrades His almighty power.

Is it bad going abroad? No, but ask yourselves with these questions:

• Are my plans going abroad according to the will of the Heavenly Father?

A faithful child of God not wants to do anything without God's blessing. This is something which we just cannot do. "Father thy will be done" was already the very successful strategy of Jesus. He succeeded. How do we know what is God's will? Pray and give God a chance to show you. Jesus promised: ask and you will be given, seek and you will find.

- Why do I want to go abroad? Is it always poverty? Or maybe just much more life style choices? Consumerism? A dream of a good life? If that is what you want, maybe you have a wrong idea of going abroad.
- Where do I want to go and for what job? There are different laws and culture in various countries. You must examine first your skills, education and expertise. The least your education the harder it gets, the less your expertise the poorer the job prospect.
- What is the price I am paying? Before you go you need to pay for application fees and agency fees, etc. Then what is the salary? How are my living costs abroad? If you spend more what is then the use of getting more?

Now you must think if you still want to go abroad.

Another topic that the youth discussed was, "MARRIAGE"

The Youth asked for the effect of marrying a non-New Apostolic and the effect to the children. The effect of this is "compromise" which is the most important part in our life. It is not impossible but harder and challenging. The compromising issue of

Another question is what to do if a girlfriend or boyfriend who is non- New Apostolic and does not want to convert to our faith. Discuss God's work with your boy/girl friend. Meet together with him/her a Brother in the ministry to explain further. Tell your friend I love you that is why I want to share this with you. But not if you love me you do what I say and become New Apostolic. Last question is, how shall we make a wise decision in choosing partners in life? Let the Heavenly Father choose. Every situation is different and it is impossible to give a general valid answer to this. It is the Apostle's task to evaluate the situation and to determine to which extend a Brother can work in the ministry under such circumstances.

Generally when a couple is separated the Brother takes a leave of absence from active ministerial duties until his personal situation is clarified. Ushualy that means until divorce procedures are over. However there are no divorce procedures in the Philippines and therefore a brother affected by this situation should consult with the Apostle who then will advice and also help to save the family if that is possible.
