What is the importance of the Confirmation Vow to the confirmants? Why they need to recite it with their parents in front of the Congregation?



The pre-requisite for God's offer of confirmation blessing is the confirmation vow from the one who will receive it and sincerely ask for it. The confirmands "Yes" word is the same "yes" word vowed on promised by their parents. The parents give their "yes" at the altar before they receive the Holy Baptism and child when he reach the age 14 is important because the Confirmand vows to remain and continue to be faithful as an adult member and keep the vow made by his/her parents when he/she was still a child. Reciting the vow with the parents and in the congregation release the parents with the responsibility to raise the child in the New Apostolic faith and welcomes the confirmand as our adult member in the congregation and forms part in the youth.
