Dear young Brothers and Sisters

Our Chief Apostle Leber held recently the first Youth Service with the word from 1. John 2:15

"Do not love the world or the things in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him"

This Bible verse is not a reprimand but rather an advice how God will bless our conduct and life-style.

Here, "world" does not refer to the globe nor

is there any reference to terms like "world-politics" or "world-trade". It does not mean nature either. However it stands for ungodly nature, anything which renounces God or stands in the way of God's will. "To love the world" means to live according to the standards of this world.

Apostle John gives us here the advice: Do not live your life after the standards of this world or a behavior that has renounced God or which is in the way of His will.

What shall we NOT DO?

- Focus only on secular (material) things – just as the rich grain farmer in the parable of the Lord
- Living just for the moment as Esau who preferred a stew of lentils over his birthright
- Have confidence in our own strength only – as written in Revelation 3:17 "I am rich, have become wealthy and have need of nothing" or as the people at the time of the tower of Babel
- Be egoistic in that we only seek fellowship if we need it but otherwise

What shall we DO?

- Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness (Matthew 6:33)
- Flee from sin as from the face of a serpent (Ecclesiasticus 21:2)
- Commit your way to the Lord (Psalm 37: 5)

He who does accordingly will be under God's blessings.

ANSWER:
