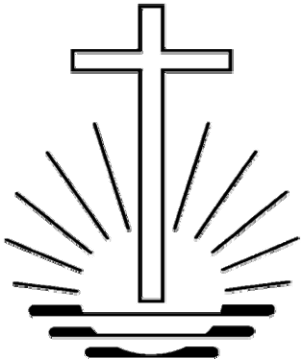

NACDC GRADUATION

The New Apostolic Childrens Development Center a Pre-school Outreach Program of the New Apostolic Church Biñan Congregation has completed its 3rd school year last March 18th. Since 2003, the church open its door to the public through educational services for the low income families in the community.

The NACDC is self-sustaining in its operational cost because the parents contribute on the salaries of 2 teachers. But they could only raise P7,000/month for 2 teachers and the parents appreciate the love of the new apostolic teachers who put the mission above the monetarial gain in the teaching profession which nowadays could be paid P10,000/month in the public school and even as high as US\$2,000/month abroad. APOSTLE LETTER BOX

Dear Apostle Hebeisen,

Why do we have a cross in our church? Does our emblem have a special meaning in our faith? Can we use this to testify the newapostolic church?



ANSWER:

Cross is the generic sign of every Christian church. It was and is used as a identification of Christians all over the world and as such also part of the emblem of the New Apostolic Church.

Cross, waves (water) and sun (light, fire) make reference to the three sacrament. Cross = Jesus, Water = God and Sun = Holy Spirit. Baptisme (God) Holy Communion (Son) and Holy Sealing (Holy Spirit) Thereby also a reference to Trinity.

The sun is raising. New hope. The nearby morning of the new heaven and the coming of Christ.

You can also see in the interpretation a sun set. Reference to end time.

There are totally 5 rays on each side. This is 10, the number of completeness. Nothing missing.

If you draw a line around the emblem you see the shape of an egg. The evidence of new life.

The Newapostolic emblem is a registered Trademark and only for use by the New Apostolic Church.

Of course when we testify we can talk about our emblem.
