

### ANSWER:

This question is elaborated on in our position paper on sexual practices and behaviors. Our office can give you a copy on request. You can also download it from www.nak.org

Based on biblical tenants and Christian tradition the church cannot condone with same sex relationships.

There is much to be said about same sex relationships and personally I do realize that it is a complicated subject not fully researched yet and a final judgment is not yet or maybe never will be possible. There are social, medical and psychological factors to be considered besides the theological ones.

In the newapostolic church homosexually oriented souls are welcome and they receive same soul care and are not discriminated. I recommend that anyone who has questions in this regard seeks confidential counseling from the Apostle.
