Two New Apostles in NACSEAsia

Apostle Zeng was born on 23rd April 1973 and grew up in a farming family in rural China. 1994 he was sealed and ordained as Priest. A year later he married and the couple was blessed with a daughter. Together with his father, a District Elder he spread the gospel and served the souls in various ministries. Even under extreme hardship he remained faithful.

Apostle Leonilo Desoloc, born 15th March 1963 comes from the Surigao Islands in the Philippines. 1982 as a young Pastor he was among the big group of clergy who became new apostolic in this historical typhoon night in Santa Cruz Laguna and was sent by Ap. Wagner as Priests to their respective areas. He served in various ministries on the islands and the Surigao mainland. Today he lives with his family in the Butuan Central Church and will as an Apostle be responsible for the whole Northern- and Western Mindanao region.

Two New District Rectors in Jakarta

The Nower of Prayer

I have been ill with diabetes for many years. One of the many complications resulting from the disease, unless regularly checked and treated, is serious eye damage.

In 1999 I lost my right eye owing to diabetes. Three months later my left eye started to deteriorate as well. I was thus medically unfit to continue in my teaching post I had a needlework teacher and went on early retirement.

Laser treatment was to help relieve the situation, but after several treatments I was left with hemorrhaging of the eye every four to six weeks. Sometimes the bleeding was so bad that I was unable to see for two to three weeks at a time. I was completely helpless at the time and could not remain on my own in our house.

My husband works at two-hour drive from our home. Since he cannot come home every evening he has a flat where he

works. Finally my specialist revealed to me that there was nothing more that he or any other specialist in the city could do for me. I was crestfallen.

Now what? I could not stay on my own. I had no alternative but to pack up and move to the town where my husband works.

My husband has been in ministry all our married life and at the end of May 2006 we had the opportunity to meet with our District Apostle. After he had listened to our concerns he brought our plight before the Lord in an earnest prayer.

Sometime has passed since our meeting with our District Apostle. Since that meeting my left eye has never bled again and I have even moved back into our home. For me this is adequate proof that miracles still happen today through the power of the ministry and sincere prayer.
