Let us talk about Him, His activity and His return, then we speak TRUTH and that brings us everlasting PEACE.

Our Family, Number 01, January 2011

I had met Nina for the first time back in 1989. We became best friends. Right from the start we felt a deep spiritual kinship to one another and made many wonderful experiences together.

In 1994 Nina travelled to Ecuador for three months. There she met a New Apostolic girl by the name Rita in the congregation of Quito. A month later I followed her there and also stayed three months to learn the Spanish language. We enjoyed various adventures together and also went to church together. When Nina's stay in Ecuador came to an end, we took leave of her with a heavy heart, but I kept writing to her during the last month of my stay in the country. One day I wrote to her that I really missed the hymns our choir would often sing, and asked her if she would perhaps be able to send me a copy of some songs.

Shortly thereafter I received a letter from her. She had enclosed the French hymn "Un seul désir ardent" (One thing have I desired of the Lord), which she just happened to have around. I was very happy about this. Rita and I practiced the hymn on the one-hour bus trip to our church in Quito.

A few years later, Nina was diagnosed with cancer. I could not fathom that this disease had afflicted her, of all people. Nina was not even in her midthirties when she died. I cannot express what I feel when I think about her and her early death. Since then the world has become a different place for me. Often I think of her and send her a little greeting through my prayers.

A few months after her death I went on vacation, and couldn't help thinking back to the times that I had spent at this vacation spot with Nina. I was deeply moved and felt as though she was very near. When I went to church that evening, I sat down in the choir to help along. I prayed intensively before the divine service and sent another greeting to Nina. When I opened my eyes I thought to myself: "How nice it would receive some sort of acknowledgement that my greeting had reached her."

After the opening prayer we stood up to sing the choir hymn: "Un seul désir ardent." I felt hot and cold shivers running down my spine. I was so moved and overjoyed at the same time that I could barely sing anymore.

At the end of the divine service, the rector of the congregation invited us over and I told him about my experience. When I came back to the hotel and was about to open the door to my room, I was suddenly struck by the thought: "My room number is the same as that choir hymn in our folder!"

I had received double confirmation! This experience brought me an enormous amount of comfort. It still comforts me even today. Whenever I think of Nina I see her laughing beside me, just like before, when we used to enjoy so many happy hours together.
