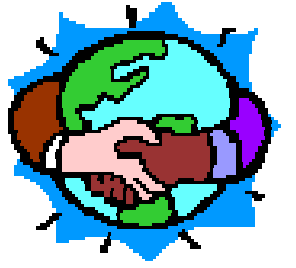

# EXPERIENCE OF FAITH

## Do miracles still happen today?

Our Family, Number 02, February 2011

*From one day to the next, a pin-sized lump had formed on my tongue. Within two days it had grown to the size of a pea. And I was in my ninth month of pregnancy...*

Trusting in God's help, I underwent some oral surgery to remove the lump. The doctor who performed the surgery asked whether I could keep my tongue steady for long enough, since he would otherwise have to put a hook through it to keep it in place. Aware that many were praying for me, I put all my trust in the Lord and said yes. Half an hour later, it was all over. Everything had gone well, and the doctor had even praised me for being so brave. Later on I still received some radiation therapy and the incision healed well. Three weeks after the operation, I gave birth to a healthy baby girl. I was very thankful for God's help and for all those who had interceded for me.

Seven years later another tumor formed in the same spot. This one was larger and needed to be removed under a general anesthetic. I dreaded this operation. In my concern, I turned to our District Elder. He asked me if I was able to believe that God also performs miracles in our day. I was deeply convinced of this and told him so. "Then let us tell that to our heavenly father," said the District Elder.

Thus comforted I went back home and confidently submitted to the operation the next day. Before getting started, the surgeon wanted to take another look at the tumor – and saw nothing! The only thing he could find was the scar from my first operation. The lump was gone! There was nothing more for the doctors to operate on. Since I had become a witness to a divine miracle in our time and on my own body, I told the doctor about the intercessions and the words of our District Elder. The learned man simply acknowledged: "There are things we human beings just do not understand – true miracles!"

It goes without saying that I expressed deep thanks to the Lord for his help and grace. I also thanked our District Elder and told him of the miracle that I had experienced in this modern age.

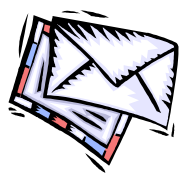
