

It is the year of resilience for one of our Apostles. On May 5, 2013 on his way home from a congregation visit, our Apostle Mercurio Nuyad met an accident. He was riding his motorcycle from T'Boli Congregation going home to Tupi.

According to Ap. Nuyad, he didn't know exactly what happened. He vaguely remembers the accident, and all he can remember now are the voices of the two strangers who helped him get up. *"Are you alright? We still have to travel far, can you manage?"* These are the words the strangers told him. When the Apostle said he can still drive, the two strangers helped him to get on his bike, put all his belongings in his bag and bid him goodbye near Polomolok. The Apostle then continued to drive and ended up in San Pedro, General Santos, the location of the previous New Apostolic church. When he could not find the church, he said he just drove and ended up in NAC Falgui (Gen. San). Upon his arrival, Bishop Pascual and his wife discovered the extent of the Apostle's accident. His face was full of blood and his arm was completely swollen. The Apostle was driving with the injury on his face and arm but didn't stop until he reached NAC General Santos.

At the hospital, it was found that his left cheekbone was broken and his left eye was affected. Operation was made and now Apostle Nuyad continues to recover from the accident.



Then came the process of quality control. As the ladies are very far from Manila, quality control could only be made once it has arrived. If something has to be changed, painstakingly the craft has to be re-done and re-stitched.








- The typhoon has affected more than 213,000 people, demolished houses and stranded people in two Mindanao regions and parts of the Visayas region, according to the disaster agency.



Maslow's Hierarchy of needs


December 2012 when Typhoon Bopha hit Mindanao.

Bohol Earthquake

- The 2013 Bohol earthquake occurred on October 15, 2013, at 8:12 a.m. (PST) in Bohol, an island province located in Central Visayas, Philippines. The magnitude of the earthquake at the epicentre was recorded at Mw 7.2, located 6 kilometres (3.7 mi) SW of Sagbayan town, at a depth of 12 kilometres (7.5 mi). It affected the whole Central Visayas region, particularly Bohol and Cebu. The quake was felt in the whole Visayas area and as far as Masbate Island in the north and Cotabato provinces in southern Mindanao.
- It was the deadliest earthquake in the Philippines in 23 years.




Typhoon Haiyan Primer


- On November 8, 2013 Typhoon Haiyan, code name Yolanda hit Philippines,
- It is the strongest typhoon recorded which devastated portions of Southeast Asia, particularly the Philippines.
- Killed at least 6,268 people in the Philippines alone.
- Haiyan is also the strongest storm recorded at landfall, and unofficially the strongest typhoon ever recorded in terms of wind speed
- As of January 2014, bodies were still being found
