

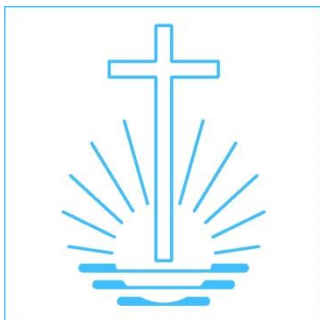

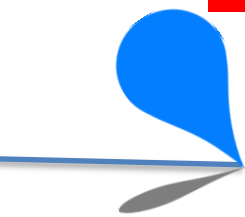

Schools Completed in Compostela Valley Funded by NAK Humanitas

Compostela Valley, Typhoon Bopha/Pablo, Rebuilding accomplished (News write up)

Shortly before Christmas 2012 ComVal area was hit by a strong typhoon code-named Bopha and locally called Pablo bringing much devastation to people, agriculture and infrastructure. Just from among the New Apostolic church members 1000 were finding themselves homeless and even 14 churches were lost, sadly in the Christmas season.

NACSEARelief started a massive relief operation bringing much needed food and other basic needs to the population. This was followed by rebuilding the churches and joining the Philippine Red Cross and other NGO's to help to reconstruct homes by providing GI Sheets and other construction material. All beneficiaries did their own labour.

In a third phase the schools were in focus. A total of 10 classrooms in four different schools could be rebuilt and turned over to the Department of Education. On 8th October 2014 the accomplishment of this program was commemorated by turning over the last 4 classrooms, two in Mamonga and two in Canidkid to the local school principals and Department of Education.

NACSEARelief is the aid agency of the New Apostolic Church in the Philippines, partnering with "NAK-humanitas" of the NAC Switzerland. At the turn over ceremony the President, DA Urs Hebeisen expressed his appreciation that this could all be accomplished in a true Bayanihan spirit and not just by distributing donations but in true Christian mutual support and cooperation.

Representatives of the board of provincial government (district 2), Hon. Jayvee Tyron L. Uy, Mayor Eutropio Jayectin led the principals, faculty and students in expressing appreciation and thankfulness for the support given by "NAKhumanitas" and its donors in Switzerland.

A special "Thank you" to all who have laboured and contributed to this successful ending. Emerging out of this disaster relief operation was also a livelihood project based on a cooperative system which already is in self-support mode.

Typhoon Yolanda



Typhoon Yolanda

Early November 2013, a deadly typhoon hit Philippines Visayas area. Yolanda (Haiyan) the strongest storm recorded at landfall, and the strongest typhoon ever recorded in terms of one-minute sustained wind speed claimed approximately 6,300 lives.

NACSEARelief, immediately sent relief goods via Bohol route. Some 2000 families in Daanbantayan, Cebu; Batad, Iloilo and Kalibo, Aklan receive relief goods.

By 2014, we started rebuilding churches, houses, community halls, health centers and schools.

Our operation is concentrated on three areas:



Batad is a fifth class municipality in the province of Iloilo, Philippines. According to the 2010 census, it had a population of 19,385 people.

In 1950, the barrio of Zarragoza was transferred to the town of Balasan.



Lavezares is a fourth class municipality in the province of Northern Samar, Philippines. It is bounded on the west by the municipality of Allen, on the northwest by San Bernardino Strait, on the south and southwest by the municipality of Victoria, on the east by the municipality of Rosario and on the north by the municipality of Biri. According to the 2010 census, it has a population of 27,464 people

Leyte is an island in the Visayas group of the Philippines.

Politically, the island is divided into two provinces: (Northern) Leyte and Southern Leyte. Territorially, Southern Leyte Province includes the island of Panaon to its south. Biliran Island, to the north of Leyte Island, was formerly a sub-province of Leyte, and is now a separate province, Biliran Province.

The major cities of Leyte are Tacloban City, on the eastern shore at the northwest corner of Leyte Gulf, and Ormoc City, on the west coast.

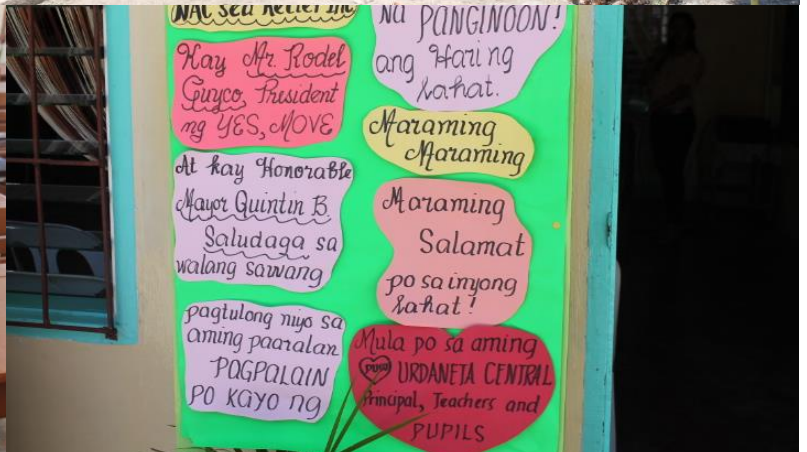

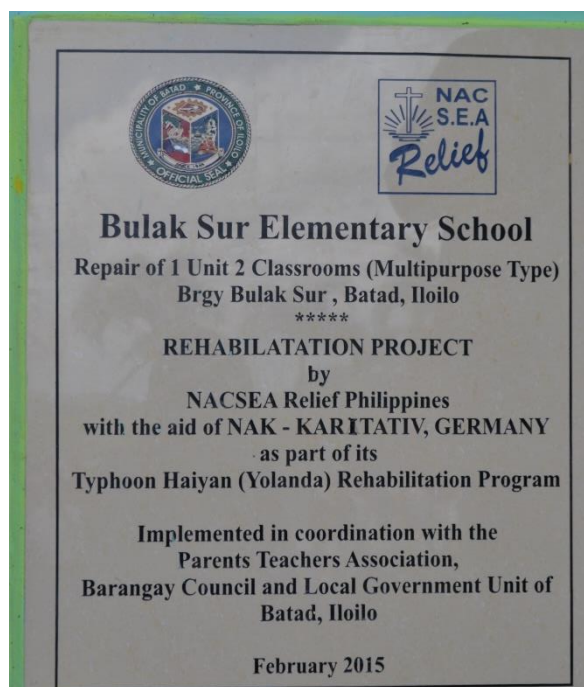

DISTRIBUTION OF FISHING GEARS:

NACSEA RELIEF INC is proud to report that with the support of NAK karitativ fishing gears were distributed to 7-coastal Barangays in Batad Iloilo last Nov. 28, 2014.

Beneficiaries have received fishing boats from other NGO's and were all very happy and thankful to receive their fishing gears from NACSEA Relief to complete the boats and make them usable for fishing. Through this generous donation the fisher-beneficiaries in 7-coastal barangays of Batad including their families, will be able to return to the sea and resume their traditional livelihoods.

The wives of fishermen were mainly involved in net repairing but also in fish drying, selling (directly to consumers) and sometime directly in fishing activity with their husband.

Fisher beneficiaries together with their families and LGU-Batad will ensure the donated fishing gears will only be used in a sustainable and eco-friendly manner. After all, "rebuilding livelihoods" can also mean aiming for something that is better than what was true before.

The survivors shared their stories of how Yolanda had affected them, their families, their livelihoods and communities and how, despite the hardships, and with the help of local and foreign organizations, they managed to keep on living as normally as possible.

Ormoc, Leyte

The settlement Purok 6 in Barangay Labrador, Ormoc City has been totally devastated during Typhoon Yolanda (Haiyan). Funded by NAK Humanitas Switzerland with joint efforts of NACSEARelief, IKP – Island Kids Philippines (PIKIFI) and One Way Outreach Church of Ormoc (OWOC) the people of Purok 6 in a joint project were empowered to rebuild the entire community.

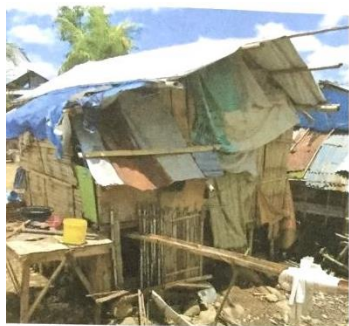
The OWOC in partnership with PIKIFI was organized and empowered the community for the rehabilitation of the settlement with participatory approach and thus BAYANIHAN System.

With allocated budget of PHP 3,312,703.00 a total of 27 concrete houses (13 duplex and 1 single) and one church building was constructed and 9 partially damaged residences were repaired.

On 15th August 2014, ground breaking was made. Projected to be finished by December 2014 the project experience some setbacks like difficulty in hauling of materials and the following typhoons which also batters Ormoc.

Another setback encountered was that some of the beneficiary wanted to change the plan regarding the constructions of toilets. This was then settled by open discussion with the beneficiary and PIKIFI. It was resolved that the original plan will be implemented.

As of June 2015, the housing needs some finishing works. After its completion, formal turnover is scheduled to take place.

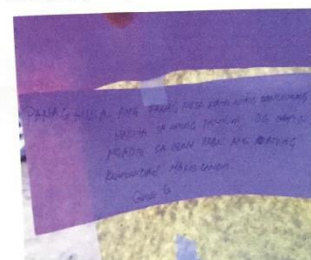

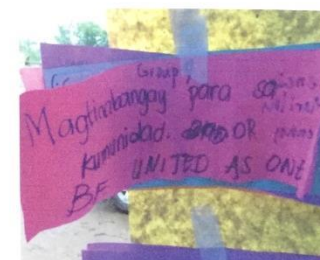

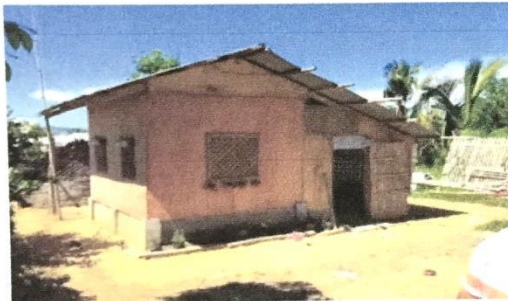

San Jose Central Church and Caretakers House

Tacloban, Leyte

New Apostolic Church's San Jose Central Church is within 50 kilometers along the seaside of Tacloban, thus when typhoon Yolanda (Haiyan) came it was one of the greatly damaged structure by storm surge, wind and flood.

The central church is the home congregation of Bh. Rogelio Puso. With his family they live in the adjacent caretaker's house of the church. When typhoon came, they took refuge on the second of the floor of the house. Placing their grandchildren on the top of the dressers as the water continues to rise. According to the bishop, at that time when the water and wind is very strong, he had given up everything to God. Uttering a short prayer, he gathered all his family nearer to the wall.

NACSEARelief took almost a week after we established contact with the bishop. Through our field coordinator Cris Ronquillo in Bohol busy with earthquake rebuilding response. Cris crossed to Leyte via boat from Bohol to Bato Leyte. From where he travelled up to Tacloban with the aim to find the Puso and family and other church members.

Once contact was established, relief assistance was arranged again via Bohol. Immediate assistance of food, water and medicine was made.

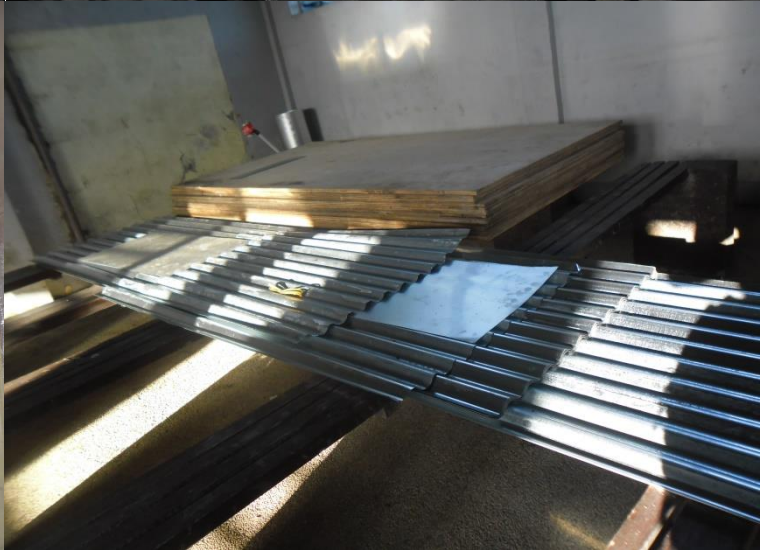
By early January 2014, San Jose Central Church's repair has started. On November 2014, San Jose Central Church and Care Taker house rebuilding project was finished. The Puso family transferred back to their home which was damaged by typhoon Yolanda. Slowly they are starting again to live in the place where home always was.

William Cabaquin and his family is one of the beneficiaries of housing as well as livelihood assistance.

His family live in Fisherman's Village a stone throw away from Tacloban airport. When typhoon Yolanda came, his wife died during their evacuation.

According to William, he and his wife together with some neighbor's children were evacuating when the storm surge came. After it hit them, they were separated and he woke up the following day without clothes far away from their house.

He said, he walked back to what was their house and searched for his wife. Unfortunately she did not survive.

With his 3 children, his house repaired and with a boat from NACSEA Relief he continues to live.

Last February 6, 2015 he was ordained as a Priest and is now serving in San Jose Central Church.

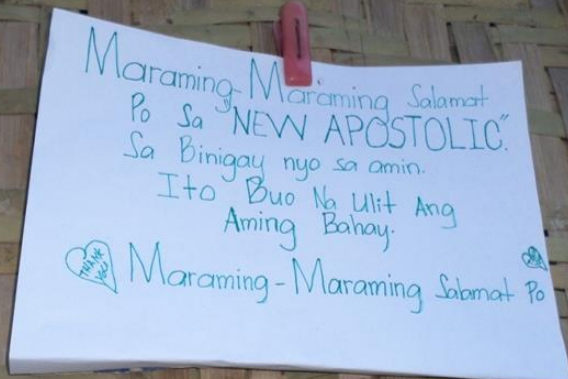

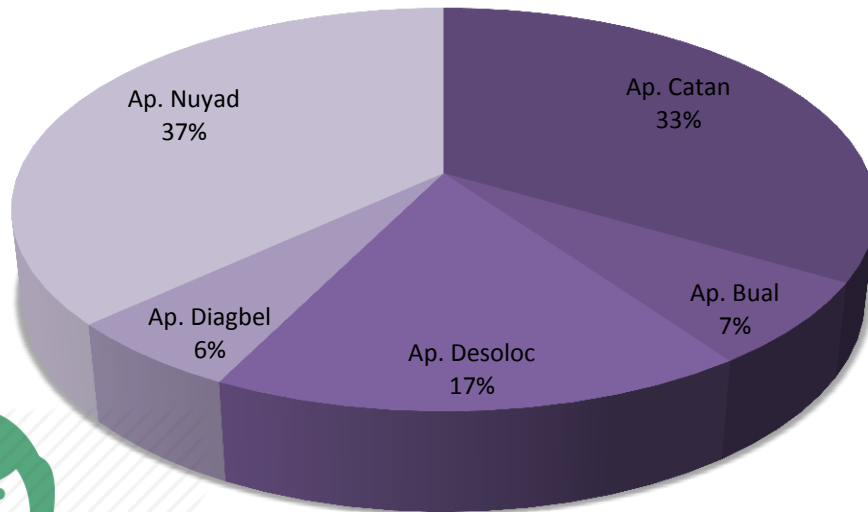

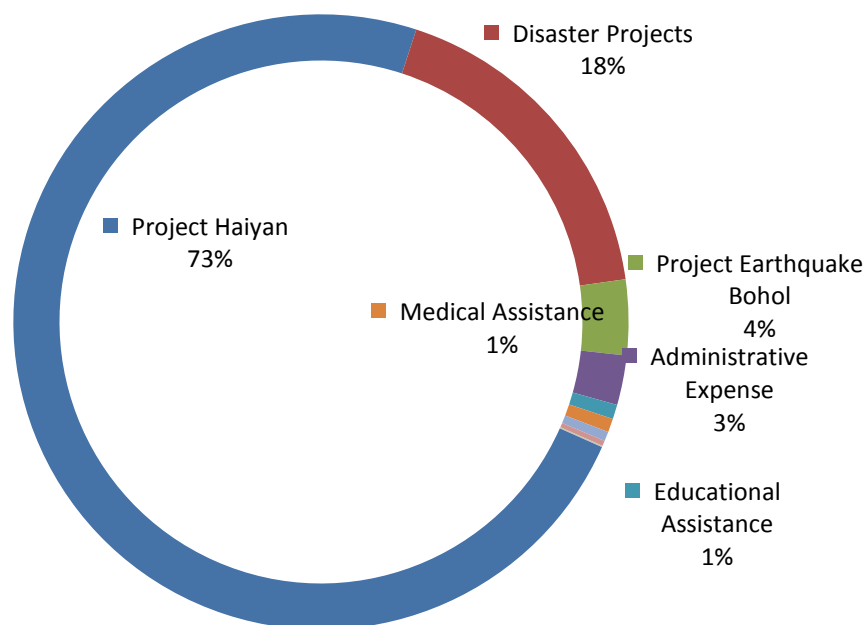
